

The Iraq War, One Year Later: More Than 10,000 Lives Lost





500 pairs of boots were laid out in formation on Chicago's Federal Plaza on January 21 to honor the US military personnel killed in Iraq. On March 18 a similar witness will take place at the Westwood Federal Building in Los Angeles, with shoes and boots representing both civilian and military deaths.
